

The presiding judge of the Precinct Municipal Court is the Honorable Jack Hall and the current deputy clerk of the court is Tanya Martin. The Precinct Municipal Court is not a court of record.

Sessions of the Municipal Court are normally held every other Wednesday from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at City Hall which is located at 1724 Main Street, Pecos, Texas. Notice for sessions of the court may be changed from time to time due to holidays and vacation schedules or to changes from the past and notify the clerk of the court session and time. You may call this court's clerk to verify the next session of the court.

The district for each court session is normally presided by either a judge or Justice, the morning/afternoon court Wednesday session. The district is posted on the outside glass pane in the back of the court room and by Hall.

If you have received a citation/notice from a Precinct Police Officer then the date for your court appearance will appear at the bottom right of the citation/notice.

The Precinct Municipal Court has exclusive original jurisdiction in the Precinct's residential tracts and for any property located in the city located in Precinct's commercial jurisdiction. In all criminal cases that:

(1) involve a crime;

(2) the defendant is from City of Pecos; and

(3) are punishable by a fine not to exceed:

(i) \$1,000.00 in all cases arising under a municipal ordinance or resolution, rules, or orders of a police board that govern the safety, zoning, or public health and sanitation, including the dumping of refuse; or

(ii) \$500.00 in all other cases arising under a municipal ordinance or resolution, rule, or order of a police board.

The Precinct Municipal Court also has concurrent jurisdiction with the district
